Many of us heard touching stories of our community supporting each other during the pandemic, those small acts of kindness, simply chatting to the that lonely person sat on the bench overlooking the

Tea and Tours - Thursday 3rd March & Thursday 7th April, 2pm

Enjoy a cup of tea and a short talk about the history of the Medieval Barn, and then explore the recently renovated West Barn and the rest of the site

Down at the Barn, Leonie Evans and friends - Thursday 17th March, 7.30pm

Singer-songwriter and multi-instrumentalist Leonie Evans hosts an evening of intimate music in the unique and atmospheric setting of the Medieval Barn. Expect to hear an array of languages and her amazing 'Frumpet' (vocal trumpet), in her own songs and pre-war jazz, blues, country, gospel and Latin music. Leonie is joined this month by guest musicians Mohamed Errebbaa and Driss Yamdah. playing Moroccan gnawa music.

Talk: The Hatting Industry and Radical Change – Tuesday 22nd March, 7pm

Hatting was a lucrative artisan skilled trade, and the Winterbourne area did very well when work boomed from the 1760s. Watleys End was built as a 'greenfield' hatting village. The cottage industry delivered economic and social gain for 100 years, but then mechanisation developed which de-skilled the trades. Local hatters resisted this change for decades, with the result that the industry here stagnated, while mills in the north with a more compliant workforce picked up the advantage. Social, economic, political, agricultural and technological reforms during this period were huge, and the fortunes of the hatting industry illustrate how this affected our local history and the lives of people in this area.

Bourne Warriors - Community Apprentice Competition (main photo above)



- Earn a potential financial return, with a projected 3.5% in this share offer

BEC's business model of raising funds has proved successful so far. Set up in 2011, the co-op has raised over £14 million, and developed over 9MWp of solar and battery assets, enough to power roughly 3000 homes. The organisation is an important contributor of renewable energy in the South West, generating roughly the equivalent of 30% of Bristol's solar energy.

It's not only BEC's members that gain from a return on investment. Over the past 10 years, the cooperative has channelled over £300,000 of community benefit payments into local sustainability initiatives, such as community gardens, education and biodiversity programmes. Also, community spaces such as Coniston Community Centre and Knowle West Media Centre have benefitted from cheaper energy rates thanks to the solar installations by BEC, meaning they have more funds to spend on their vital services.

The cooperative currently has 1200 members, but is looking to grow and diversify its membership to help create a just energy transition.

Anyone can invest in BEC's withdrawable shares, from as little as £100. Investors are projected to receive a 3.5% annual return. The share offer is open until 31st March 2022. For more information please see: https://bristolenergy.coop/share-offer-2022/



News from the Floral Friends of Frampton

Welcome signs that spring is on its way in the park!

To cheer everyone up in the dark days of winter, there are signs that spring is not too far away, we found all of the above bulbs in the park.

Planters

Also brightening the days are the planters that are becoming more colourful as the winter bedding (much of it sourced from Iron Acton Garden Centre) comes into bloom.

Behind the scenes at FFF

You've seen all the planters and hanging baskets around the village, the wildflower areas at the Park and the Glebeland, the bulbs that pop up in the spring – but have you ever wondered how they got there? FFF volunteers have a many and varied set of skills; from researching and sourcing plants, through designing displays, liaising with suppliers, negotiating prices, planting bulbs, filling planters with bedding and perennial plants, to watering and deadheading. We also organise and promote events (remember the plant sales? The floral hat festival? The floral boot trail? One day we will be organising them again!). As well as applying for grants, fund raising, keeping the accounts, to making cakes, tea and coffee!

For example, the hanging baskets are supplied. ready planted by Merediths of Yate, at the end of May when they are hung around the village by FFF volunteers, who also water and deadhead them twice a week during the summer months. They are removed at the end of September and the spent plants are put into green bins and any usable compost is spread on the Beesmoor Border to improve the soil. The baskets are then cleaned, sterilised and stored, before being relined with capillary matting and taken to Merediths for planting, who return them to us for hanging - and repeat!

Mothering Sunday A message from Val Slade – Licensed Lay Minister



March heralds the season of spring and is the time of year we find ourselves thinking about women through a host of special remembrance days. Beginning with International Women's Day, a global celebration of achievements of women in

society; and Woman of Aviation Week (WOAW), which marks the anniversary of the first female pilot's licence issued 8th March 1910. As someone who once learned to fly I had never heard of this, but am pleased it exists to raise awareness for girls of all ages informing them of equal opportunities within aviation industries. Many countries in Europe also celebrate Mother's Day on different dates to honour the mother of the family.

Here in the UK we celebrate Mothering Sunday, which has a different historical meaning to Mother's Day, unrelated to gender. Mothering Sunday is the fourth Sunday in the period of Lent, and today we give our mothers, and those we think to be like our mothers, presents, cards and flowers. Centuries ago it was considered important for people to return to their home church once a year, their 'mother' church. This took place in the middle of Lent becoming a celebrated occasion and a reason for family reunions, when children who were working



away returned home. These included those working in domestic service and apprentices given the day off to visit their families. It is thought that as they walked home along country lanes, they would pick spring flowers for their mothers; these might have included violets, primroses and daffodils. Families would then enjoy traditional food, since the fasting rules for Lent were relaxed that day. The Simnel cake has a long association with Mothering Sunday and consists of a fruit cake with two layers of almond paste (marzipan), one in the middle and one on top. The cake is made with 11 balls of marzipan on top representing the 11 disciples, Judas not being included; sugar violets would also be added for decoration.

I wonder how many of you have been able to return to your home church; perhaps you live too far from 'home'. My own home church looks the same but has become part of a larger community, since my village has grown into a small town. It has been modernised enabling it to cater for all the different needs of parishioners and a variety of community events. It is a good example of how the church as an institution can become mother to its whole community.

Fromeside churches have ministers, men and women, who excel at mothering and sustaining the spiritual life of the people of the benefice. Their role model comes from the example of Jesus teaching his followers to love one another (John 15:12). Jesus has excellent mothering qualities which lead us towards a community-centred Christian way of life into which all are welcome.

"I love playtime because you get to mess about with vour friends."


"I like playtime because we get freedom time and toast with butter for 10p."

So, with a song in my heart, I will bid you goodbye for now.



'ESCAPE Pain Courses' Available at local Active Lifestyle Centres

Over 8.75 million people in the UK suffer from chronic joint pain, which can prevent them from being active. However, activity will help improve physical and psychological wellbeing and ensure a healthy social

ESCAPE-pain stands for **Enabling Self-management** and Coping with Arthritic Pain using Exercise. It is an evidence-based, group rehabilitation course for people with chronic joint pain developed by Professor Mike Hurley and approved and commissioned by the Clinical Commissioning Group, NHS (CCG).

The progressive exercise programme will help people learn how to cope with pain, how to exercise safely and pace themselves, manage their symptoms, and be around people who have the same condition.

The Escape Pain courses will be available in the five Active Lifestyle Centres across South Gloucestershire

(Bradley Stoke, Kingswood, Longwell Green, Thornbury and Yate). The courses are aimed at people over 45 years, who have been suffering from chronic knee and hip arthritic pain for three months or more, and need a supervised fitness programme so that they can work toward independent living and mobility. Each session will help participants understand their condition, educate them so that they can go away, and be more independent. Gloria Isaac took part in one of the Escape Pain courses. She said, "Attending the Escape pain cours has benefited me: I was having cortisone injections in my right knee every 6 months, however I have not felt the need for any further treatment. I have seen improvement in my wellbeing

mentally and physically as well as improvement in my muscular strength around my knee and other muscles too. I am now continuing with a follow up class for arthritis at the leisure centre, so I benefited from the course a lot."

Jim Rollo, Head of Lifestyles, said, "Following the success of our GP Healthy Lifestyle Referral Scheme, Active Centres are proud to receive this commission, and deliver this vital service that has the potential to improve the lifestyle of so many people within our local communities who suffer from chronic knee and hip arthritic pain." He adds. "The Escape Pain courses are underway, and participants have already noticed improvements mentally and physically."

The Escape Pain sessions are free and supported by NHS England. The courses will run up to March 2023. If you think you could benefit from taking part in any of the above sessions, please speak with your local GP practice or Health Care Professional about

Although not many in Winterbourne are aware of it, the village is home to one of the longest standing and experienced cage bird societies in the South West. Founded in 1972, Severn Counties members have kept and bred a huge range of birds over the years and this year is our 50th Anniversary year.

There are approximately 1 million pet birds of various species, from canaries, budgerigars and finches through to larger or more exotic species, and any bird keepers or people considering getting a pet bird are



very welcome at any of our meetings, which are held at the Methodist Church Hall in Winterbourne on the third Thursday of each month at 8pm. We cater for all ages and levels of experience, and are particularly glad to see younger people interested in the hobby

Our meetings may include talks by a member or guest speaker on bird keeping, talks on wild birds all over the world, social events (such as an outing to Slimbridge in the above photo) and many more. We have an annual breeding award meeting for the latest results, which this year will be at the 17th March meeting.

Our experienced members, several of whom have won prizes at national shows for the birds they have raised, are always available for new keepers in need of advice. The club also has a library of guides to bird keeping covering all sorts of species, from canaries to back garden chickens.




