
Events at Winterbourne Medieval Barn



Aerospace Bristol launches £500,000 appeal to help inspire future engineers, as the museum celebrates its 5th birthday

ever to fly, with visitors able to step on board Concorde, explore the passenger cabin, glimpse into the cockpit, and learn about the supersonic passenger jet through a show projected on to the fuselage of the iconic aircraft.

At the celebrattion event the museum unveiled a new Bristol Fighter display, with the wooden frame of the WWI aeroplane suspended above the museum's existing replica.

Feeding Fromeside Food Hub

As the Cost of Living Crisis starts to bite this winter. locals have set up their own 'Food Hub' to help reduce food waste and mitigate food insecurity in Frampton Cotterell, Coalpit Heath, Winterbourne and the wider area. The food hub will open once a week and will offer free food parcels, hot drinks and snacks at a community café.

The venture will run on a 'pay as you wish' basis. This means that for those on the breadline, food parcels, hot drinks and snacks will be available for pennies or even for free. For those who can afford to pay more or for those who perhaps don't need assistance but who think the project represents a valuable asset to the community, there will of course be an opportunity to donate much more to help support the project!

Anyone is welcome to use the food hub and while the food parcels are designed for those who really need help with aroceries, no one will be turned away or asked searching questions about whether they need help or why. The cafe, on the other hand. welcomes everyone, regardless of income and the coordinating team hope that the Food Hub can become a real central point in the village where people can make friends, warm up in the colder months and create a strong sense of community spirit and mutual assistance.

The project has been set up with a grant from Community Brightside which operates under the auspices of South Glos Council. The money has been awarded to the Food Hub team to empower them to work towards reducing health inequalities in the local area.


The Hub will operate out of Zion United Church, Woodend Road in Frampton Cotterell, who have volunteered the use of their accessible building and kitchen so that the whole community can benefit from this project with minimal overheads.

Despite the presence of food insecurity and deprivation in the neighbourhood, most support services (such as food banks) are located several miles away. With local buses cut to the bone this means that many families and individuals struggle to access much needed support.

The Feeding Fromeside Food Hub will endeavour to mitigate some of these difficulties, while reducing food waste in the local area by distributing surplus from local food businesses. Winterbourne Coop have already begun donating to the Hub and the coordinating team are hoping that other supermarkets and food businesses will soon follow.

The food hub is an ambitious project for a small village and the coordinating team would certainly welcome more volunteers and food donations.

Local charity Paul's Place says thank you to its amazing community and celebrates **Three Good Things this year**

Paul's Place is a charity that enhances life for physically disabled adults. As they reflect on their year, they share their appreciation for people in their community who have donated, fundraised, or joined an event.

Alex Stumpp. Communications Officer at Paul's Place says, "This has been another year of recovery after the pandemic. We're grateful to everyone in our community for their support. Every ticket bought, every donation from groups like the WI and others, means we can help disabled people live life to the full. Thanks to people's support, our doors stayed open, and we are able to offer our full range of services again. Thank you!"

The charity does many good things but here are three to show how community support makes a difference in the lives of disabled people.

Everyone deserves a holiday

Fully supported holidays for disabled people returned in 2022. Usually, the day centre at Coalpit Heath closes while staff support a small group of disabled people go on holiday but this year, the doors stayed open. This meant that some people could enjoy 5 days away, while others were attending their regular day service in Coalpit Heath. The charity had the staff and resources to do so this year, due to donations and support.

Hannah, who uses the charity for support, said, "I really enjoyed my holiday with Paul's Place at Holemoor Stables. Thanks for a great week!"

The return of holidays was also welcomed, as these not only provide service users with independence and fun experiences, but their carers enjoy some

rest too. Take service user Matt. while on holiday this September, the Paul's Place team encouraged him to take a leap of faith and overcome his fear of water. Thanks to the safe and nurturing environment created by the staff team, as well as fellow service users, Matt (for the first time in 20 years!) decided to take the plunge and go for a swim! A support worker Leanne shares, "My favourite bit must have been when we came back Friday afternoon and the day facility was still open and full of people. Matt got off the bus and straight away told everyone how he got in the pool. He was so proud of himself for overcoming one of his fears."

Fun and friendship

Having fun with friends shouldn't just be limited to support in the daytime for disabled people. Paul's Place evening programme supports people to spend time with friends and get out and about in the community.

As a disabled adult, it can be hard to not only find accessible venues but also have the confidence to go out. A fully supported evening Social Group is helping people connect with other disabled adults within a supportive and inclusive environment. We all know that social connections like this are vital to people's health. In 2022, thanks to renewed support, our evening programme returned to full strength and now disabled people are going out two nights each month.

Staying active with inclusive sports

It's been another year of getting active and enjoying sport at Paul's Place. The charity has been able to fund a project that gets people active, at Yate Outdoor Sport Complex. The achievements have been phenomenal! Thanks to the right support, Andy (who is blind) has been running around the track. Other service users with limited mobility. have tried out equipment like frame runners and wheelchair adapted bikes.

Other sporting activities include a weekly trip to the gym to use the exercise equipment. The charity also has a successful Boccia team who have won many medals in regional and national competitions. This is all made possible thanks to the funds raised that keep their minibus on the road. The bus takes them to weekly Boccia practice as well as competitions around the UK.

Alex Stumpp, says, "We are sharing these three Good Things to say 'thank you' and to show that with people's support, our charity really can help disabled people to live life to the full. I want to wish everyone a 'Happy Christmas', but this year it's proving hard.

How do I say 'Happy Christmas' to those people living in our area who are struggling with the cost of living increases? There are people who are already choosing to go cold rather than enter debt to heat their homes. There are those who are choosing to go hungry in order to be able to provide the food for their children. Some people are fearing increases in rent and mortgage repayments, facing the real possibility of loosing their homes. How can I wish them a 'Happy Christmas'?

How do I say 'Happy Christmas' to those people living in our area who have been left bereft and lonely by two years of global pandemic. There are those who are facing their first or second Christmas alone without the company of their spouses or partners, lost to Covid, cancer, disaster, or the passing of time. There are those whose worlds' have been rocked by accidents, infections, or struggling to address the effect of trauma on their mental health. There are those wondering how long they might survive, or whether they really want to. What right have I to say to them 'Happy Christmas'?

The Christian Faith claims to have 'Good News', the Greek word from which we get 'Gospel' having been the equivalent term used for a proclamation of victory in battle in the Roman Empire. I believe in the core of my being that it really is 'Good News' that God the Son came down from heaven and became man, was crucified, and was raised again. but what good is promised 'eternal life' when life means pain, misery, and suffering?

In the Eastern traditions, the choice by God the Son to become united with humanity at Christmas, means humanity can be united to God in a process called theosis. This means we can share in divine attributes: we can be loving, peaceful, kind, gentle, faithful. We can improve the lives of those around us through our generosity. I don't simply mean financially, but with our time and resources.

I'm asking myself: can I offer my neighbour a warm place to sit? Can I spare nonperishable food to donate to a food bank? Can I treat my recently diagnosed friend to a day out to do their favourite thing? Our Churches are asking similar questions, and are hoping to offer warm safe spaces this winter (keep your eyes peeled for details). Perhaps you might ask yourself the same questions; perhaps, regardless of your faith (if you have one), you might be good news for someone this Christmas?

Many of us wish we had the ability to make people's problems go away, but one of the challenges of life is learning we are not the messiah. However, if I can bring relief to those around me in need, if I can be 'Good News' for those who desperately need some. then maybe (just maybe), I'll be able to look them in the eye and wish them a 'Happy Christmas.'




