Voices Project at Paul's Place helps 21 Disabled adults share their stories and highlight the challenges disabled people face on a daily basis

The voices project raises awareness of the issues that matter to disabled people. Communications Officer Alex is managing the project, sharing, "We believe our members (service users) have a voice, something important to say. At Paul's Place, we are all about providing new experiences and giving disabled people the opportunity to try something new, learn new skills and build their confidence. This project has helped our members find new ways to express themselves creatively."

The charity worked with freelance journalist, Debra Hearne to interview people about the things that matter to them. She has been working with Paul's Place service users to help them share their passions for things like music, or even discuss topics such as, "What can be done to improve accessibility?". And, "How does it differ if you have an invisible disability vs a visible disability?."

Service user Rebecca shares why she is part of the project, "It would help me to know that others are aware of my condition, it will help them understand me better"

Another participant Paul Kendall shares, "I want to help other people know what it's like to have a stroke. It's up to the individual to be positive otherwise you'll just spiral down. I do feel a little upset thinking about it all but I want people to know they're not the only one going through this. If you can talk about these things – it becomes easier."

They have also been working with a freelance poet.



Poetry is a great way to express yourself and for many of the people the charity supports, this is the first time they have had a chance to write their own poetry. Andy wrote poetry about his experiences of becoming blind and learning to run with Paul's Place at the Athletics track in Yate. "I wanted to show what blind people can do. Most people think you can't do this, can't do that. I'm glad I took part, it just explains what it's like for me and how I cope. Putting people in my shoes. It was exciting to hear my poems back."

"The stories are powerful and hope to educate the public on disability matters, as well as connect with those who have experienced similar things whether that's the effects of a stroke or becoming visually impaired. These stories will help people feel less alone", Alex shares. The poems and interviews will be shared on the Paul's Place website for you to read and listen to, as well as their social media. St. Michael's School – Festivals of Light









Whilst the daylight hours have been short over the last couple of months, we have been learning about festivals of light and what they represent in our school and communities.

In the lead up to Christmas, our Key Stage 2 children held a Christingle Carol Service at St Michael's Church. Father Malcolm led the service and each of the junior classes took part in presenting what the Christingle candle symbolises. Year 4 explained how Christians believe that Jesus is the Light of the World:

"We looked at the way different light sources can guide, warn and celebrate. By listening to his teaching, we can learn how to avoid dangerous things, just as the lighthouse keeps the ships away from danger. Jesus can guide us - by following his example, we can be better people; just as following the torch stops us falling off the path in the dark. And following Jesus helps us celebrate life and living; just as the candles lit on a birthday cake help us to celebrate. We also considered how cats' eyes reflect light from the car headlights, and wondered how well we reflect the light of Jesus."

Some children created some pastel art of candles to show during the service. We thought about how the light radiates in different colours, spreading light into the darkness in the way that light overcomes dark and shows us the way.

In R.E lessons we looked at other festivals of light celebrated by different communities. The story of Rama and Sita is remembered during the Hindu festival of Diwali, when diva lamps are lit to guide Goddess Lakshmi to their homes to bring luck and good fortune and fireworks are let off to celebrate. Jewish people remember the Miracle of the sacred lamp that burned for 8 days with just one bottle of oil. Every night during the festival of Hanukkah, a candle is lit on a special candle holder called a Hanukkiah.

In our "Christmas in a box" workshop, Jo Strange, Father Malcolm and members of St Michael's church came to talk to Year 4 about the shining light that led the shepherd and wise men to the stable where Jesus was born. Children learned the story of the nativity through creating different treasures to keep in their boxes, each of which helping them to recall specific parts of the story in detail. Much of what they had learned was later recalled in our class lessons about the Nativity, showing how engaging the activities had been to help them to remember so much.

Although days are now getting longer as we move into spring, we still think about the symbolism of light. Next month our school will be celebrating Easter with a special Faith Day, when Father Malcolm will talk to us about the significance of the Easter candle, and the comparison of the darkness in church on Good Friday, to the light that fills the church celebrating Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. Our school candle also continues to be lit in assemblies, reminding us of the light that Jesus brings to many Christians' lives. Each day at the end of our assemblies, the flame is extinguished and the message is taken with us with the words "Let the light shine in us today".



Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

As the Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) for Avon and Somerset, I am the voice of local people in policing. My role is to hold the Chief Constable to account for delivering policing that is efficient and effective.

I spent over 30 years as an Army Officer, so I understand service life, and the pressures those protecting communities and people face.

One of my responsibilities includes setting the police and crime objectives for the area through the Police and Crime Plan. The Plan is the blueprint for local policing and outlines specific areas to be improved and delivered by the force.

I published my Police and Crime Plan last year and my objectives are: preventing and fighting crime; engaging, supporting and working with communities, victims and partner organisations; leading the police to be efficient and effective; and increasing the legitimacy of, and public confidence in, the police and criminal justice system.


As part of my role, I'm also responsible for setting the force budget and determining the policing part of the council tax, known as the precept.

I would like to thank those who have recently completed my precept survey and shared their thoughts about my proposal to increase the policing part of the council tax by £15 for the average band D household.

At the start of February, the Police and Crime Panel supported my proposal to increase the precept.

This funding will help reduce the impact of Avon and Somerset Police's funding gap but will still leave a projected deficit of £3.4 million in the vear 2023/24.

Inflationary increases combined with limited additional funding from central Government have left a funding gap that, without the precept



increase, would have resulted in significant cuts to police staff and services.

I know that many households are facing difficult financial circumstances. However, as your PCC. it would have been irresponsible for me not to address this issue and help reduce this deficit while I had the opportunity. We will be using the £3.4 million reserve funding to address the shortfall so that the Chief Constable has capacity to develop a sensible savings programme while still delivering an effective, efficient and legitimate service.

I always try to make myself available to those who need to speak with me. Over the past 18 months as PCC, I have regularly engaged with local people, communities, MPs, and councillors.

I have been holding a series of Councillor Forums over the past few months around the Avon and Somerset region and when these come to an end in March, we will be restarting our community engagement days.

On Saturday 18th March we plan to celebrate St Patricks day with an old Skool evening of dance and merriment!





Voter ID Requirements

Frampton Cotterell Parish Council would like to remind our parishioners and others in the surrounding area, of the new Voter ID requirements established by the Elections Act 2022. This will come into effect in May 2023.

This Act means that all voters will have to show a valid form of photographic ID at polling stations when they go to vote. Failure to show appropriate ID may mean you aren't permitted to vote!

From May 2023, photographic ID will be required for voting in: Local elections. Police and Crime Commissioner elections, UK parliamentary byelections and Recall petitions.

Photographic ID will also be required for UK General elections from October 2023.

If you do not have any eligible form of photographic ID you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate. To apply for one of these certificates, or you'd like to find out more about the introduction of photographic voter ID. please visit the Electoral Commission website - www.electoralcommission.org.uk/i-am-a/ voter/voter-id

National Hedgehog Day - and what we're doing for Hedgehogs!

Did you know that February 2nd was National Hedgehog Day? We did! Here at Frampton Cotterell Parish Council, we care a great deal about hedgehogs. Hedgehogs have been in severe decline over the past 20 years - it has reached such a critical point that the International Union for the Conservation of Nature has now placed hedgehogs on their Red List for vulnerability of extinction.





ANDY'S MAN CLUB #IT'S OK TO TALK

Andy's Man Club was set up in Halifax in June 2016 following the tragic death of Andy Roberts, who died by suicide. Andy's mother Elaine and brother-in-law Luke Ambler decided to start a club to reduce the stigma around male mental health issues, and give men the opportunity to talk with their peers about whatever storms they're going through.

The group now has 117 clubs across the UK, as well as an online option for anyone who can't get to one. All meet at 7pm every Monday except Bank Holidays.

There are two Andy's Man Clubs in Bristol. Bristol North meets in the Jessop Suite at the Seat Unique Stadium aka the County Cricket Ground. Bristol South meets at the Knowle West Media Centre. The clubs are run by a team of volunteer facilitators, all of whom originally joined the club to get support for themselves.

Below we are honoured to share with you the experience of a local man, who found the support he needed from Andy's Man Club.



My Name is Andy. AKA Barts.

I'm 42 years old and I started attending Andy's Man Club at the beginning of June 2022. I can honestly say it has changed my life for the better in such a short time.

I have always been

the happy-go-lucky guy. I've spent most of my life brushing things under the carpet or saying "I'm fine" when I wasn't. This would lead to me having meltdowns or kicking off for no apparent reason.

I first walked through the door at the County Cricket Ground in Bristol for Andy's Man Club after the above had become apparent. My whole life I'd been living with anxiety, and then in June I was diagnosed with depression.

The anxiety was so strong that I didn't want to upset people, or I wouldn't speak up as I didn't want the confrontation - the only way to describe it is walking on eggshells my whole life!

Attending Andy's Man Club has made me less anxious by nature. Everyone listens and I get to talk and no judgement is passed. Also you realise you are not alone, others are going through a storm themselves.

No person is the same at Andv's Man Club. However we can all relate to each other, and that's because we all had a reason to walk through that door on our first evening. Even the facilitators!

In November 2022 I became a facilitator and have really enjoyed leading groups. It really is as simple as having a chat over a brew and a biscuit – all provided free of charge.

Andy's Man Club has given me that different outlook I needed. I now use the word "perspective" more than I ever have in my life. I recently did a radio interview on BBC Radio Bristol to talk about what made me join Andy's Man Club and also what Andy's Man Club has done for me!

I'm not here to sell Andy's Man Club to anyone. All I can say is it has changed me for the better, and if you are going through a storm yourself or know somebody who is, Andy's Man Club's doors are open 7-9pm every Monday and it might help lighten that load.

ANDY'S MAN CLUB is a free-to-attend talking group that runs every Monday night at 7pm, excluding bank holidays.

For over a year, the group has operated at a venue in Bishopston – the Seat Unique Stadium, BS7 9EJ.

There is now a Bristol South group that meet at the Knowle West Media Centre, BS4 1NL. Any man over the age of 18 is free to attend either of these groups, with no registration, referral or booking process.

Minister's Message

By the time you read this, Lent will have begun, which, for many people, especially for Christians, is a time for self-denial. So why should we do that? In the Bible we find a challenging answer, which is, so that we can fast and pray! But surely nobody likes denying oneself, since it is not a natural human desire. I remember as I was leaving my senior school, our Headmaster said this in his farewell address "The hardest thing in life is to say no when vou're longing to say ves!"

Why should God want us to deny ourselves? What benefit can come from it? Surely God knows that it will only make us miserable! But there are other ways of self-denial which are not just about fasting and praying, since it can also mean doing things that perhaps we find difficult – like loving our neighbour as we love ourselves. Some examples of this could be; giving up more of our time and money to help the poor, the needy, the sick, the helpless, the homeless, the starving, the abused etc.

Jesus who is the King, and who will be the judge of all people, makes this quite clear in the Gospel of Matthew 25 in the parable of the 'Sheep and goats'.

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." Then the righteous will answer him. "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?" Then the King will reply, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

Self-denial is also about taking up our cross just like Jesus did, so maybe he might be saying to each one of us during this Lententide "Take on me, for my yoke is easy and my burden is light" which is another quote from Matthew's gospel in Chapter 11. What did he mean by that?

In the Old Testament a voke was often referred to as the law and the people's submission to it, as per the teaching of Scribes and the Pharisees. There were numerous Jewish commandments outlined in the Old Testament, Adherence or conformance to all of them, could become a 'heavy' burden indeed!

But in contrast. the voke of Jesus can be considered as 'made to measure' which can also mean 'well fitting.'



Legend has it that Jesus as a carpenter made the best fitting yokes in the area. So, what did he mean by his burden would be light? It's not that a burden is easy to carry, but it is laid upon us in love and when we pass on that love it can make even the heaviest burden seem light!

Maybe you remember the song by the Hollies back in the late 80s, 'He ain't heavy, he's my brother.' Here are some of the words, "The road is long, with many a winding turn, that leads us to who knows where. who knows where.

But I am strong, strong enough to carry him. He ain't heavy, he's my brother."

So, on we go, his welfare is of my concern. No burden is he to bear; we'll get there. For I know he would not encumber me. He ain't heavy, he's my brother.

If I'm laden at all; I'm laden with sadness That everyone's heart, Isn't filled with the gladness, of love for one another"

When we have the love of God in our hearts, then we can we know that 'our burden' is to love God above all things in return and also all that he has created. Then the burden of self-denial becomes light and can even put a song in our hearts.




