



"The teaching enables pupils to make good progress, encompasses effective behaviour management and is supported by suitable resources," it said.

The team of inspectors spent two days observing lessons, talking to pupils and examining their work. They also held discussions with staff and governors, observed extra-curricular activities in the school's 28-acre grounds and attended assemblies. Questionnaires completed by staff, parents and pupils from both the school and nursery were also taken into consideration.

This latest report builds on the positive outcomes of a more comprehensive inspection at the school and nursery in 2018. The ISI's Educational Quality Inspection Report found that Tockington Manor School produces pupils who "demonstrate self-confidence and self-awareness of the highest quality". It also commended the school on the personal development of pupils, which it said was excellent.



Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC). Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

This week, the National Police Chief's Council and the College of Policing published their 'Tackling Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG)' report. I very much welcome this first national assessment of the policing response to VAWG, particularly as the key area of focus is the national VAWG framework in responding robustly to allegations of police-perpetrated abuse, sexism, and misogyny within policing services.

As PCC, I want to make it clear that misogyny is unacceptable in any sphere, especially within policing. When public confidence in the police is low. Avon and Somerset Police must continue to demonstrate that misconduct will not be tolerated. This national report is important in ensuring transparency and accountability in police performance in tackling VAWG.

Chief Constable Sarah Crew and I agree that officers and staff who think misogyny, sexism and misconduct are acceptable, and ultimately, betray the force's values, will be dealt with swiftly and dynamically.

I will continue to seek assurances from the Chief Constable regarding what is being done to prevent and tackle any misconduct within the force and, where it's found, ensure officers and staff are held accountable.

In our most recent Performance and Accountability Board (PAB), the Chief Constable discussed the importance of increasing the number of women within policing to help restore women's confidence and be part of this muchneeded cultural shift.

I want to thank Chief Constable Sarah Crew and Acting Chief Officer for People and Organisational Development, Louise Hutchison, for joining me for my PAB. I hope those who watched the session found the Chief Constable's answers helpful and might even consider joining the police service to help make a difference.

Somerset PCC's Facebook page (@AandSPCC) or on our website. The next PAB will take place on 12 April at 4pm and be streamed live on our Facebook page.

Moving on, I know that dog theft is a wide concern for the people of Avon and Somerset. To mark National Dog Theft Awareness Day, my team and I spoke to Avon and Somerset Police's Animal Welfare Legislation Officer PC Natalie Cosgrove.

She told us that the force recorded 16 cases of dog theft in 2021 and only five in 2022. While a reduction and, I'm sure reassuring to many, that is still five cases too many. If you are a dog owner, there are specific security precautions you can take to make dog theft harder, including camera doorbells, keeping doors locked and sensor lighting outside your house.

I would also like to remind those who have a dog to not leave it unattended in your car, in your garden, or tied up outside of shops. Remember, microchipping is not only a legal requirement; it means your dog will be much easier to track down if it is stolen. I also urge dog owners to consider DNA tracking to help identify their dog if it is stolen and then recovered by the police.

More information on DNA tracking can be found on the 'DNA Protected' website. If your dog has been stolen, you should immediately contact the police and report the crime as theft. This way, we can ensure preventative work is carried out to keep our pets safe.

As Prince of Wales, Charles has been preparing for this moment for most of his life, under the tutelage and guidance of his late mother, Elizabeth II. He will be recorded in history as the longest ever heir apparent. and the oldest to ever accede to the British throne at the age of 73.

Charles Philip Arthur George was born on 14th November 1948, during the reign of his grandfather King George VI. After the death of the King in 1952, his mother Elizabeth became Queen and Charles became heir to the throne at just three years old.

Charles was educated at Cheam and Gordonstoun schools, in the footsteps of his father Philip. He was the first heir apparent to attend school rather than receive private tuition. His time at Gordonstoun was hard, he referred to it as "Colditz in kilts" but later reflected, "...it taught me to accept challenges and take the initiative." He left in 1967 with six O levels and two A levels in French and History.

Charles went on to read Archaeology and Anthropology, then switched to History at Trinity College, Cambridge. He gained a 2:2 Bachelor of Arts in 1970. As Prince of Wales, he also spent a term at the University College in Aberystwyth, in order to study the Welsh language and history. In 1975, Cambridge University awarded him a Master of Arts. Charles joined the Royal Air Force and trained as a jet pilot, then the Royal Navy, where he qualified as a helicopter pilot. The Prince's Trust was founded in 1976 with the £7,500 severance pay from the Navy. Since then, Charles has established sixteen more charities which raise over £100 million annually.

In 1981, he married Lady Diana Spencer. They had two sons. William born in 1982 and Harry in 1984. The couple divorced in 1996, and Diana was tragically killed in a car accident a year later.

In 2005, Charles married Camilla Parker-Bowles. The official title of Princess of Wales was never publicly acknowledged, instead Camilla became known as the Duchess of Cornwall.

The Duchy of Cornwall Estate was established by Edward III in 1337 for the heir to the throne. As Duke of Cornwall, the 53,000 hectare estate provided Charles with a private income to fund public, charitable and private activities, effectively making him financially independent. The estate passed to Prince William when he became heir apparent.

On 8th September 2022, Queen Elizabeth passed away peacefully and King Charles III became the new monarch. Coronation plans have been laid out for many years, under the codename 'Operation Golden Orb'. It's thought that the service will be smaller than the last coronation in 1953, and include different faiths and communities to reflect the change in British society. The Church of England ceremony will be broadcast internationally, and requires an oath and anointment, delivery of the orb and enthronement.

The coronation of King Charles III and Camilla takes place in Westminster Abbey on 6th May 2023. Long live the King!
