Frampton Cotterell WI – **Celebrating 70 years!**


The 27th November 2022, was Frampton Cotterell WI's 70th Anniversary!

Events at Winterbourne Medieval Barn

Winterbourne Medieval Barn was built in 1342 for Lord of the manor, Thomas de Bradeston, and this nationally important raised-cruck structure survives as a magnificent example of the medieval builders' craft. It is now managed by a volunteerrun charitable (WMBT) trust who aim to preserve it and keep it available for community uses. The Trust raises income to maintain the site and all its buildings, by putting on community events including varied talks, music and drama performances, and heritage craft and skills education.

WMBT is always looking for more volunteers to join the large friendly local

team. It's a great way to meet new people and help in the community. No weekly commitment is required and you can choose to do as much or as little as you like. Volunteers can welcome visitors, help on the bar, serve refreshments, set up and clear away at events, help with car parking, or be more involved by helping with organisation and admin tasks throughout the year. The Garden group meets weekly, while the Barnforce maintenance group meets one Saturday a month. The Trust would also be keen to hear from local people who would like to take on more responsibility by joining the team of keyholders who take turns to unlock and lock up the Barn when there is an event. Contact details are on the website, or speak to Ceara on 0117 403 1536 (office manned part-time).

There are normally several community events each month, some during the day, some in an evening, but there are few things held in the Medieval Barn in January or February as it is a bit chilly! Small events can be held in the West Barn throughout the winter as this is heated.





Feeding Fromeside Food Hub

As the Cost of Living Crisis bites this winter, locals have set up their own 'Food Hub' to help reduce food waste and mitigate food insecurity in Frampton Cotterell, Coalpit Heath, Winterbourne and the wider area. The food hub opens once a week and offers free food parcels, hot drinks and snacks at a community café.

The venture will run on a 'pay as you wish' basis. This means that for those on the breadline, food parcels, hot drinks and snacks will be available for pennies or even for free. For those who can afford to pay more or for those who perhaps don't need assistance but who think the project represents a valuable asset to the community, there will of course be an opportunity to donate much more to help support the project!

Anyone is welcome to use the food hub and while the food parcels are designed for those who really need help with groceries, no one will be turned away or asked searching questions about whether they need help or why. The cafe, on the other hand, welcomes everyone, regardless of income and the coordinating team hope that the Food Hub can become a real central point in the village where people can make friends, warm up in the colder months and create a strong sense of community spirit and mutual assistance.

The project has been set up with a grant from Community Brightside which operates under the auspices of South Glos Council. The money has been awarded to the Food Hub team to empower them to work towards reducing health inequalities in the local area.


The Hub will operate out of Zion United Church, Woodend Road in Frampton Cotterell, who have volunteered the use of their accessible building and kitchen so that the whole community can benefit from this project with minimal overheads.

Despite the presence of food insecurity and deprivation in the neighbourhood, most support services (such as food banks) are located several miles away. With local buses cut to the bone this means that many families and individuals struggle to access much needed support.

The Feeding Fromeside Food Hub will endeavour to mitigate some of these difficulties, while reducing food waste in the local area by distributing surplus from local food businesses. Winterbourne Coop have already begun donating to the Hub and the coordinating team are hoping that other supermarkets and food businesses will soon follow.

The food hub is an ambitious project for a small village and the coordinating team would certainly welcome more volunteers and food donations.

tradition of wassailing which is having a revival in recent vears.

The term wassail goes back to anglo-saxon times and is a form of toast. "Waes Hael" - Be of good health. The reply to this toast is to say "Drinc hael" - Drink healthily. There is a rich collection of wassail songs from the villages around Stroud, where Robin is part of a community group that has re-introduced the practice. The songs reflect a tradition that was widespread in England but is different to the apple wassailing that has become popular in recent times. Close to 12th Night, wassailers would go from door to door, or around the pubs, carrying a wassail bowl and singing a wassailing song. The theme is to wish everyone a prosperous year.

We enjoyed a spread of finger food and Robin also regaled us with some of the traditional folk tunes sung during wassailing.
