Early Summer at Winterbourne Medieval Barn

Medieval Fayre, Sunday 11th June, 11am-4pm

In 1393 Blanche de Bradeston was granted the right to hold a fair adjacent to Winterbourne church each June and October. In continuing recognition of this, the Medieval Fayre returns to the Barn on Sunday 11th June. Living history group The Company of Chivalry will re-enact life as it was in a military encampment during the Hundred Years War in the 1300s when the Barn was built. So come and wander around the authentic tents and fire pit, chat to the enactors, ask questions, and watch them go about their daily tasks as they would have done them 700 years ago. There will be a full programme of activities throughout the day including talks and demonstrations about many different aspects of medieval life. Plus live music, a wide range of artisan craft stalls in the Barn, activities for children including hands-on craft and dressing-up, and plenty of excellent food and drink stalls. Entry £5 (child £1). Tickets can be pre-booked online to avoid gueues on the gate. Free parking at Winterbourne Academy (High Street) with free shuttle buses to and from the Barn all day. No parking on Church Lane. Limited Disabled parking is available at the Barn but it must be reserved in advance, see website.

Barn Dance, Saturday 17th June - What could be better than a proper Barn Dance in a real Barn especially when that barn is nearly 700 years old? Join excellent local band Sargents Mess for traditional music in the Barn. No dance experience is needed - caller Rob shouts out the moves as you go along. Lots of fun for all ages. The Bar is open from 6.30pm. Tickets £10 (child £7). Free parking on site.

Talks - On Thursday 22nd June the incomparable Professor Ronald Hutton returns to the Barn to talk about the Medieval and Early Modern Witch Hunts, 7pm and the impact they have had on beliefs and human rights today.

On Thursday 13th July, 7pm Chris Bigg talks about the local aircraft industry over the past 100 years in his talk Wings over Filton. And while not a sitting down talk, you can also come to the Barn to find out more about bats at an evening Bat Walk on 24th August, 7.30pm, for which numbers are strictly limited and bookings are already being taken.

Craft workshops - There is a Pottery Taster afternoon on Saturday 17 June where you can have a go at hand-building a bowl, then add a glaze and 'sgraffito' a pattern into the glaze. And at the start of the school summer holidays there is a Fused Glass workshop specifically intended for adult and child pairs to each make a decorative panel. All workshops must be booked well in advance (some sessions are already sold out).

Theatre performances - Ticket are also on sale for the two summer drama performances in the Barn -Shakespeare's wonderful comedy Twelfth Night, performed by the excellent Festival Players on Thursday 20th July, 7pm, and this year's family drama Hercules, another delightfully daft show from IKProductions, perfect for all those young superheroes, on Sunday 23rd July, 2pm.

Barnforce – we are looking for some more volunteers to join the Barnforce team, who spend 2-3 hours per month doing general maintenance and tidving up at the Barn. They usually meet on the third Saturday morning of the month at 10am, but this can depend on weather, events at the Barn, bank holidays, etc. The next planned meeting is Saturday 10th June, to prepare for the Medieval Favre on Sunday 11th. Use your savings as a force for good

With the launch of their new share offer. Bristol Energy Cooperative aims to bring people together to tackle the climate emergency and the energy crisis. The not-for-profit is seeking to raise £1million to develop more green, clean energy projects across the region, at speed.

When you invest in the energy cooperative, your money will:

- Tackle climate change by funding the delivery of pioneering clean energy projects such as rooftop solar panels on community buildings
- Support local community with cheaper energy bills for host buildings, and raising community benefit funds for local initiatives
- Democratise energy ownership, allowing communities and individuals to feel the benefit of renewable energy generation
- Earn a potential financial return, with a projected 5% in this share offer

BEC's business model of raising funds has proved very successful so far. Since it was set up in 2011, the co-op has raised over £15 million, and developed over 10MWp of solar and battery assets, enough to power roughly 3,250 homes. The organisation is an important contributor of renewable energy in the South West, generating roughly the equivalent of 30% of Bristol's solar energy.



It's not only BEC's members that gain from a return on investment. Over the past 10 years, the cooperative has channelled over £350,000 of community benefit payments into local sustainability initiatives, such as community gardens, education and biodiversity programmes. Also, community spaces such as Easton Community Centre and Knowle West Media Centre have benefitted from cheaper energy rates thanks to the solar installations by BEC, meaning they have more funds to spend on their vital services. In December 2022 BEC completed a 1MW rooftop PV install at the second Bottleyard Film studios (TBY2). This is by far its largest rooftop scheme to date, and BEC believes it's the largest community rooftop solar array in the UK.

The cooperative currently has 1,500 members. and is looking to grow and diversify its membership to help create a just energy transition.

Anyone can invest in BEC's withdrawable shares, from as little as £100. Investors are projected to receive a 5% annual return. The share offer is open until 17th July 2023. For more information please see: https://bristolenergy.coop/share-offer-2023/



Minister's Message - Summer-time of transition

I find the early summer to be an odd sort of season. We find ourselves in the middle of the year, celebrating the longest day and beginning the season of holidays, for rest and recuperation. At the same time, whilst we are in many senses, 'In the middle of things', it is also a time of endings and transition. I remember all too well from my own youth, and later years within the education sector, that late June brought with it the promise of the end of exam season for one thing, and for many young people that also marks, in practical terms, the end of their secondary, sixth form, or university education.

I myself am currently in one of these times of transitions. At the end of this month I will temporarily leave the Fromeside area, where I have been serving in the Church of England as a deacon this last year, and I won't return until the start of July. when I shall, God-willing, have become a priest also. Whilst the ministry I have performed as a deacon (visiting those who struggle to get to churches, administration, making arrangements for services amongst other things) won't stop, I will be entering a new phase of service, able to perform weddings, bless people, and preside at Holy Communion.

These times of transition can be a cause for celebration. They can also be unsettling, creating anxiety around the uncertainties that lie ahead. Chapter 42 of the prophetic book Isaiah, with its roots in the Jewish faith around 2500 years ago, was written during such a time of unsettling transition. The author writes "Thus says the LORD...Do not fear...When you pass through the waters, I will be with you, and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned." We find a similar notion the words of the Liverpool Football Club anthem, sung by Bryan Terfel and Andrea Bocelli at last month's coronation concert: "You'll never walk alone."

I find these words to be a great comfort, the idea that I am not alone when life is tough. Any person of faith who has encountered life in all its fullness knows that faith and belief doesn't promise an easy ride (quite the opposite in fact). Rather, in the Judeo-Christian tradition we affirm that when there are times which feel like crossing stormy waters, or walking through fire, we are not alone. God is with us, even when we feel abandoned.

Whether you are going through a time of transition this summer, or time of hardship, or a time of joy, may you know that you are not alone, but are joined by someone who knows what it is you're going through, whom cares, and who longs to bring you to the other side.

Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

I would like to start with a huge thank you to all the police officers who ensured that The King's Coronation Bank Holiday weekend was enjoyed safely by all across Avon and Somerset, as well as in the capital.

There was also so much good work happening as part of the Big Help Out Coronation celebration that it would be remiss of me not to acknowledge all the community spirit and dedicated citizens across our area who volunteer their time all year round to create safer and better neighbourhoods for evervone.

On that note, I am pleased to inform you all that the Commissioner's Crime Prevention Fund grant has officially opened. This grant, set up by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) in partnership with Somerset Community Foundation and Quartet Community Foundation, aims to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour through community projects and activities across the region.

I would like to congratulate and thank all the local community groups and organisations previously awarded this grant. They have delivered some fantastic crime-reducing initiatives and activities.

I implore local organisations and community groups to apply for this worthwhile funding to reduce antisocial behaviour and make our communities safe.

In our most recent Performance and Accountability Board (PAB), the Chief Constable (CC) and I discussed the quarterly performance report, which looks at Avon and Somerset Police's (ASP) performance against the national policing priorities and ASP's Police and Crime Plan.

The data from the quarterly performance report provided an opportunity to reflect on the police's current performance and ask questions regarding what steps are being taken to make necessary improvements for our communities.

Our next PAB will take place on 14 June at 10:30 am and be streamed live on our Facebook page.



May 15th marked the start of Operation Sceptre. a national initiative to combat knife crime. This targeted initiative aims to reduce the prevalence of knife-related violence, increase public safety, and engage communities in the fight against this issue.

Proactively tackling knife crime is central to my Police and Crime Plan. I encourage people to safely discard any weapons or knives they may carry in the weapons surrender bins installed by Avon and Somerset Police.

Last month, new surrender bins were installed in areas where we know they are needed to offer people a safe and anonymous way of getting rid of a weapon. If you know someone who carries a weapon, we ask you to encourage them to surrender it. Find your nearest weapon surrender bin on the ASP website under Crime Prevention Advice.

ASP and its partners already carry out a large range of activities to raise awareness of and combat knife crime, and the work of the Violence Reduction Units (VRUs) is at the heart of this. The Police work closely with the VRUs and help to deliver talks to young people in primary and secondary schools, running Blunt Truth workshops in partnership with the NHS and hosting pop-up information stands around various local areas.

While we have seen a reduction in street-based knife crime across Avon and Somerset, more still needs to be done to ensure people feel safe in their communities. Knife crime ruins lives. Let's raise awareness, educate, and stand against knife crime.

Restoring Local Woodlands

Restoration of the Splatts Abbey Wood and Sims Hill woodlands has only been possible via help from the local communities and University students, and in partnership with South Gloucestershire Council.

Faith Terry-Doyle of the SU at UWE said - "It has been absolutely fantastic to work with the dedicated volunteers from the woodland committees. Student volunteers from UWE Bristol and the University of Bristol have given hours of their time transforming these local woodlands to enhance biodiversity and wildlife. We have a small group of inspirational Student Project Leaders here at UWE Bristol, who help to run and organise workdays for students to learn practical skills in woodland management, as well as giving them a chance to spend time outdoors and meet like-minded people."

UWE Student Project leaders Will Bearne; John Hoyos; Stefan Bigsby; Tom Day said: - "It has been great to see the progress we have made over the academic year. Over the winter period we have been removing the old tree stakes and coppicing the woodland to allow the wildflowers to grow, as well as building a new bog garden, which we have finished just in time for spring. Volunteers have been learning many new skills including tree planting and tree maintenance. As project leaders we greatly appreciate the help UWE and UoB student volunteers provide every workday, without them we wouldn't be able to complete the work we set out at the beginning of each academic year. So far there are close to 50 student volunteers who have come at different workdays to help, it's a big number and shows Conservation Volunteering is of great interest to them, we look forward to welcoming other student volunteers and encourage anyone with an interest to become a conservation volunteer."

On behalf of the community representatives on the Splatts Abbey Wood committee, (Andy Ward,

Jenny James, David Bell, Isabelle Plummer) - Fred Hillberg said - "I remember Splatts Abbey Wood when you had to fight your way from one end to the other and was a bit of an adventure playground for the little gang I was in with my schoolmates. There was also an adjoining Woodland which later disappeared. It was therefore of great interest to me when, about twenty years ago, I read that South Gloucestershire Council were looking for volunteers to help manage and renovate and preserve this Ancient Woodland for the benefit of the community. The Woodland is now owned by the MOD and leased to South Glos Council. It was hard work initially for the local volunteers , which included staff from the MOD, to open up the woodland by Coppicing and establishing pathways. Progress was very slow for a number of years, until we were joined by volunteers from the UWE, and this made a tremendous difference. Projects were achieved in months which previously had taken years, and thankfully that partnership continues to flourish today, giving the local community a facility of flora and fauna that we can all enjoy and protect for the future."
