



Jenny had some wonderful slides of the birds, animals

and cultural life of the people. We particularly enjoyed her imitations of bird calls and animal

News from Coalpit Heath WI



This month Alex gave us an informative talk about the work of St Mungo's.

St Mungo's is the largest provider for the homeless in the South West. They have three main areas of provision.

Their emergency outreach teams go out

every night to help those people who are sleeping rough. They also provide 256 spaces every night in accommodation and a have a recovery college to help provide links to employment by providing courses in literacy, construction and digital skills.

In 2021 over 2,463 people were helped across all services while 1,515 people were supported by outreach teams in the South West. To help support their work, members brought along lots of donations of items requested by the charity.

Donations also came in for the local Food Bank. These are being taken in to their branch in Yate by one of our members who volunteers there.

Our Vice President, Lynne, braved a head shave in August, in memory of our friend Annie. All money raised is being shared between Paul's Place and Willow Riding for the Disabled. So far Lynne has raised £600 which is amazing!

In Memory of Her Majesty QUEEN ELIZABETH 1926-2022

We very much wanted to acknowledge the passing of Her Majesty the Queen Elizabeth on 8th September and express our gratitude for her inspirational and constant presence in all of our lives.

The sense of loss is enormous. Throughout her long and remarkable life, The Queen gave our country and the Commonwealth untiring service. She represented our country for more than seventy years; ever-present in our lives and a constant reminder of the values of determination, generosity and compassion. 90% of the country has only ever known the Queen as our monarch.

As Queen, she held regular (usually weekly) audiences throughout the terms of 14 British Prime Ministers, from Winston Churchill to Boris Johnson. Just two days before her death, Her Majesty, determined to carry out her duties to the end, appointed Liz Truss as her 15th Prime Minister. She met 7 Popes and her reign also spanned 14 American presidents, from Truman to Joe Biden. She met them all bar one, Lyndon Johnson.

Before she became Queen, she had said, "There is none of my father's subjects from the oldest to the youngest whom I do not wish to greet." During her reign, she visited every realm and every region of the UK, returning to some many times over. Initiating the 'Royal Walkabout', it is stated that nearly a third (31%) of the UK population claim to have met or seen the Queen in person (Our Gran has met her twice!).

In total she visited circa 128 different countries and travelled over a million miles. As Head of State she acted as diplomat and hostess making some 300 State visits, and welcoming over 110 Presidents and Prime Ministers to the UK on official visits.

Her Majesty supported and encouraged achievement in many different ways. The UK honours system enabled her to confer titles such as MBEs, OBEs and CBEs on people from all walks of life in public recognition of their merit, service or bravery. "Some of them are very cleverly discovered," she said. "That's very important, that the system does discover people who do unsung things, that perhaps the local people know about but nobody else does, and that's very satisfactory." During her reign approximately 400,000 such awards have been made and well over 1 million people have attended garden parties at the Palace.

"I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong."

The Queen has sent around 100,000 telegrams to centenarians in the UK and the Commonwealth and more than 280,000 telegrams to couples celebrating their diamond wedding (60 years) anniversary.

Those closest to her often talked about her wicked sense of humour, which became apparent to the rest of us during some big national moments such as the 2012 Olympics opening ceremony featured a skit in which she accompanied Daniel Craig as James Bond from the palace to the Olympic Stadium; her own idea, which she had kept secret from the rest of her family. This year, her Platinum Jubilee celebrations included her playing herself in a short video with a CGI version of Paddington Bear, bonding over a shared love of marmalade sandwiches – finally revealing the secret of what she'd been keeping in her handbag for all those years!

And let us not forget she was also a mother and grandmother, a matriarch as well as a monarch. She was married to Prince Philip for 73 years, had four children, eight grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren. For them as well as us, she was a symbol of stability, resilience, and wisdom.

Paul's Place at Home: Tech Borrowing scheme helps blind service user stay connected

Paul's Place at Home was created in response to the lockdowns of 2020 and 2021. Staff members continued to support physically disabled adults at home with telephone befriending and daily Zoom activities.

The lockdowns highlighted a digital skills gap within those the charity supports. As a result, once their day facility reopened, they wanted to make technology more accessible for their members (service users). They held a series of IT training workshops and created the Tech Borrowing Scheme.

The Tech Borrowing Scheme allows service users to borrow a refurbished device from Paul's Place (such as an iPad) and receive 1-1 tuition in how to best use the accessibility features to see if it is suitable.

This scheme helps those who do not have the funds to waste on a device that might not suit their disability. it also helps those who have had a bad experience with smart devices to try something different before investing in one. If the device is suitable, they can then purchase it from Paul's Place, which will then go towards funding another device, which can be used by the next generation of service users.

Andy is the first service user to have successfully learned how to use an iPad, and has chosen to purchase it. He is blind and uses the many accessibility features on his iPad mini. Thanks to some support from staff at Paul's Place, and his own hard work and dedication to learn how to use the device, he is now able to read his own emails, go on Facebook, find information and chat to friends online. He also loves listening to podcasts, his favourite one

being about the latest technological advances for people who are blind or visually impaired.

In his words: "I love it! I feel good about using it. It has made a big difference. I like that I can read my own emails and if there's nothing on TV, I can listen to my podcasts. I also like reading the posts on the Facebook member's page. I am really loving it."

This is a prime example of how we provide social activities that connect people, reduce isolation, improve health and wellbeing, and give people the opportunity to develop new skills, enjoy new experiences and live life to the full.

Paul's Place is a charity that enhances life for physically disabled adults. We do this by providing social activities that connect people, reduce isolation. improve health and wellbeing, and give people the opportunity to develop new skills, enjoy new experiences and live life to the full.

Paul's Place was established in 1995 when a group of physically disabled adults got together to create a social club that they could access. Paul was the name of a founder member who sadly died before the club had its' first meeting. In his memory the other group members decided to call the club Paul's Place.

Over the last 25 years Paul's Place has evolved into a week-day service where support is given to physically disabled adults through a variety of projects. On a weekly basis Paul's Place supports 200 adults and provides over 9,000 support sessions a year for disabled adults.

"It has opened my eyes to the feeling that, as a disabled person, we can, we matter, that we do have a voice. That was and still is probably the most lifechanging thing to me" Service User Ben.

"They make him feel – for want of a better word... normal. That he can do things. That he can make what he wants to, talk to who he wants and do what he wants. He's not pressured into doing anything he doesn't want to do. I do think Paul's Place is really positive and there should be more places like it" Carer of a Service User

Paul's Place's vision is a world that embraces disability and includes everyone, ensuring that all people can live their life to the full.

Frampton resident Toby completes his Bearathon challenge, raising over £20,000 for St Peter's Hospice

Eleven-vear-old. Toby Fletcher, completed his Bearathon challenge in style on July 5th 2022 and received a huge welcome from his family, Hospice staff and Bristol rugby. Toby ran his Bearathon in memory of his Nanny Ju.

Toby attends Winterbourne Academy and lives in Frampton Cotterell. His family are all involved with Frampton Cotterell RFC - Toby and his brother Barney have played with the team since they were five, dad Giles coaches at the club and mum Claire volunteers to run the junior kitchen. Rugby is a big part of their lives.

As well as immersing themselves in their local club, the family regularly attend matches to support the Bristol Bears. Toby's Nanny Ju was a huge rugby fan and came to all the matches with them. When his Nanny became ill, Toby decided to take on a challenge that involved the rugby that she loved so much.

Throughout the 21/22 season, Toby vowed to run one kilometre for every point conceded by Bristol, to raise funds for local charity, St Peter's Hospice, who looked after his rugby-mad. Nanny Ju after she was diagnosed with cancer.

Toby's raised more than £20,000 on his Bearathon challenge, which began last Autumn. It's been a big ask, as Bristol Bears haven't had the best of seasons this year and Toby reckons he's run 718km in total - the equivalent of running from Bristol to Germany - sometimes in rain, storms, and hot weather!

Preparing for his final run, Toby arrived at the Hospice in Brentry where he was surprised to be met by Lenny the Hospice mascot, and the nurses and doctors who'd turned out to thank him for his endurance and effort, and wave him off on the last leg of his epic challenge. Toby set off flanked by a Hospice nurse, travelling the 10km from Brentry across the Downs to the Bear's Ashton Gate Stadium.

Arriving to cheers and applause Toby was met by many of the St Peter's Hospice and Ashton Gate team, Bristol Rugby supporters and his hugely proud family.

Pitch side, St Peter's Hospice Chief Executive, Frank Noble presented Toby with a Bristol Blue glass Rugby ball sculpture to mark his achievements and a giant tub of Haribo Tangfastics (his preferred choice of sweets!)

"Toby is one of Frampton Cotterell's juniors and what an inspiration and shining star this young man is.

His commitment and passion to raise £20k for the charity that helped his nan is a remarkable achievement.

The challenge was made even more challenging by Bristol Bears difficult season but Toby was out there come rain or shine. Well done Toby, you have made all members of Frampton Cotterell rugby club feel very proud and we can't wait your for next challenge!"

Toby's mum Claire has been supporting him every step of the way. Claire said: "As a family we are incredibly proud of what Toby has achieved, not only has he raised an amazing amount of money but he's inspired other young people to take on challenges and go that extra mile.

"There have been so many times he hasn't wanted to run but the support he's received from friends, family and most importantly, the rugby community have given him well needed boosts during the challenge. He has loved the support from the Bristol Bears players and staff and cannot wait to cheer them on next season."

This is true whether the path we take is a change of direction or a deepening experience of our inner being, known as our soul or spirit where, if we allow him to be. God is working his purpose out. It is so easy to find a reason to wait, procrastinate, waiting for the perfect day to arrive; but like in the natural world, often an external event can be the catalyst that gets us moving.

The tradition of living a life based on the stories of Jesus in the Bible give us a starting point to look at who we are; and what we are. That inner soul or spirit whatever you want to call it. Where is God in your

The inner being has its seasons. There are times of unquestioning, happy experiences and there are times of disturbing doubt. There are times when everything in the garden of our life is clear and bright, and times when it seems hard and dry. Plus, there are times when we feel alive and in tune with the world; God's world which makes his presence so vividly clear. God working his purpose out for each of us. A quote from the Bible in John's Gospel chapter 15:4-5. 'Remain in me and I in you. As a branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it remains part of the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in that person, bears fruit in plenty; for apart from me you can do nothing...'

So, we simply have to take the RIGHT ACTION. Love one another. Be humble in all we seek to do and say. In his earthly ministry Jesus was very emphatic about the importance of RIGHT ACTION and apparently much less concerned about RIGHT BELIEF. Its rather ironic that much traditional religious practice reverse this emphasis, so that the demands of orthodoxy can become dominant.

Jesus describes himself as 'the way'. He invites us to follow him if we want to know the way. First, we follow him through his earthly ministry, learning from him 'on the job' as he shows us what it looks like in a human life to respond to the demands of justice and love. And then he invites us to follow him through a dark valley, where we discover the cost of living true to the best we can be. He urges us not to be afraid when we face opposition, that the true life will inevitably provoke the shadow that the light will reveal.

'Stay with me' he urges us and don't be afraid, because I am walking every step with you. Life itself is sometimes hard, with stony stretches, but it leads to the fullness of a life beyond our comprehension. Jesus' repeated invitation is disarmingly simple: follow me. He doesn't say 'worship me', he doesn't say 'go to church', he says follow me, and this means quite simply learning to walk with him at your side.

But to follow him we do need to be part of the body of Jesus' followers and as part of that body we learn from each other and WANT TO WORSHIP TOGETHER.

So, thank the Lord, O thank the Lord, for all his love.


