For more than 30 years, The Childrens Hospice South West (CHSW) has been dedicated to helping local families make the most of short and precious lives.

The charity has three hospices across the south west, supporting more than 500 families: Charlton Farm near Bristol supports more than 200 local children and young people with lifelimiting conditions and their families with a range of free services, all available 24 hours-a-day. 365 days-a-year.

Support for the whole family includes short breaks; specialist medical, palliative, emergency and end-of-life care; play and music therapy; activities for siblings; and bereavement support. During the Covid pandemic, the charity adapted its care model to extend support to families' own homes.

When Noa died at Charlton Farm in November 2018, aged three months old, the care, compassion and support the family received from the hospice helped give them the time and space they needed to say goodbye. Here mum, Jo explains why the family will be forever grateful to Charlton Farm for the vital help and support during Noa's life and after she had died.

"Me and my husband, Jim and our daughters Nellie, aged 3 and Ada aged 1 love coming together to visit Charlton Farm and reflect on the memories that we had with Noa. One thing that we love about the support at Charlton Farm is that, despite our girls not being born when Noa was here, members of staff have built lovely relationships with them to help them process and understand grief, having lost their sister they never met. It's incredible how they intentionally want to help support your grief for a long time after, even though our time there was so brief."

"We visit Charlton Farm every year on Noa's anniversary which is really special for us, and maybe that won't be a forever thing, but now, while the girls are small, it's really great getting





to take them somewhere specific where they get attention and we get to mark Noa's anniversary and somewhere she actually was. Our favourite place is the trees in the garden where we take photos, because that was the first place Noa was properly outside in her life."

Jo has recently welcomed her fourth baby girl and the family look forward to continuing to share precious memories made with older sister

CHSW needs around £11m a year to run its three children's hospices, and around 85 per cent is raised through voluntary donations. Their promise is to 'make the most of short and precious lives across the South West'.




The children could choose which enrichment workshop they wanted to do. Some of the enrichment workshops that the children recently took part in were: musical theatre, jewellery making,



Meet your PCC – Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC), Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

In the summer, Chief Constable Sarah Crew made an announcement regarding institutional racism in Avon and Somerset Police.

This is a challenging issue to face. However, through initiating and continuing these uncomfortable and difficult conversations, the Chief Constable is demonstrating openness, courage and willingness to be held accountable by the communities that she and our police officers and staff serve. I have let the Chief Constable know I support her and have full confidence in her leadership.

Culture change is not something that happens overnight; it takes a minimum of five to 10 years and involves looking at many areas within the service. This includes improving our vetting and selection processes, retention, and progression of staff, how police complaints are handled and, crucially, the training given to the workforce within the wider police family.

We recently discussed the issue of institutional racism in July's Performance and Accountability Board. The meeting, which was broadcast live, allowed me to ask the Chief Constable how she intends to improve police conduct and standards. Next, I would like to take this opportunity to highlight the devastating effects of courier fraud. This type of fraud occurs when fraudsters contact victims by telephone pretending to be a police officer or bank official. Victims are asked to cooperate in an 'investigation' by attending their bank and withdrawing money or foreign currency from an exchange or purchasing an expensive item to hand over to a courier for examination who will also be a fraudster. At the time of handover, unsuspecting victims are promised the money they've handed over will be reimbursed but, in reality, there is no further contact and the money is never seen again.

Recent data from the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau shows that individuals aged 70 or older lost over £12.6 million to courier fraud last year. I urge family members to be vigilant and educate their loved

ones about the risks, including unexpected phone calls. couriers. and visitors. Remember. banks and police will never send



Finally, Avon and Somerset Police joined all five police forces and Police and Crime Commissioners in the South West and the South West Regional Organised Crime Unit (SWROCU) as part of the region's ongoing work to target and disrupt organised crime groups harming our communities through drug supply.

Thanks to the action taken. Avon and Somerset Police is the top out of all forces for the number of operations focused on drug supply disruptions, and all five police services in our region are in the top 10 and have been for the past two years.

In Avon and Somerset, officers recently seized over three million pounds worth of cannabis and arrested 20 people in relation to crimes linked to the illegal cultivation of the plant.

This operation continues to go from strength to strength. We collectively continue to make our communities safer by targeting the criminals bringing drugs and violence to our region as well as protecting the vulnerable they seek to exploit as workers or as users of the drugs they supply.

Taking a regional approach really does make a difference; so much so, that the number of county lines in our region is decreasing as criminals are having to change the way they operate.

The message is clear, the South West is no place for drugs or drug dealers.

Update from Jack Lopresti, MP

This month I have focused on 3 issues in our area, our national defence and defence industries, jobs and access to health services.

I was recently part of a roundtable discussion at the National Composites Centre with multiple employers including MBDA, Leonardo, GKN, BAE Systems, Rolls Royce and Babcock. We discussed multiple issues relating to the work the NCC do to support the defence industry in our area and enhance the technology base in our area. The NCC is part of the catapult network, designed to massively progress regional technology investment, encourage cooperation between companies and promote high-value manufacturing in the UK economy to help give British manufacturing a competitive advantage. In the discussion I emphasised the importance of educational engagement by STEMfield companies and the necessity to get young people engaged in science and engineering so that we can maintain excellence in manufacturing and produce the next generation of scientists and engineers.

I was also able to visit Babcock (photo below)and meet with Chief Technology Officer Dr Richard Drake, where I had an interesting discussion about their innovative projects. It was great to see such cutting-edge technology being developed right here in our area such as the Skynet satellite programme. We also discussed the importance of the recent AUKUS agreement. In parliament I also got to meet with apprentices from major Filton employers Airbus and Rolls-Royce to hear about their progress and their future career plans.



Access to health services is one of the most important issues for our area I recently visited Paula and Andy at Almondsbury Surgery to discuss primary healthcare provision. We also talked about their new access model, being introduced in July, which will enable greater access to clinical professionals at the practice through an online system. I also had the opportunity to have



a very informative meeting with Maria Kane, CEO of North Bristol NHS Trust at Southmead Hospital. We discussed the improvements made to cancer care by the trust, as well as domiciliary care and their impressive apprenticeship program with several hundred apprentices currently at the trust. I also heard about the exciting proposals for a new elective care centre with 4 theatres which will be a major boost to their operation.

At the SGS College Employer Conference this month (above photo), it was good to see so many local employers. Very interesting to hear presentations from Principal Sara-Jane and Matt and Chloe from Business West discussing business engagement, and skills development in our area as well as how the college can further develop their relationship with business and provide the skills required by employers in our area. I also visited the Engineering Centre at Abbeywood School to discuss the new University Technical College sleeve concept being introduced with representatives of Olympus Trust, UT Colleges, The Baker Dearing Educational Trust and several employers in our area. The UTC sleeve concept involves an advanced engineering facility located within a wider school framework. This should provide not only Abbeywood students, but students from across the Olympus Academy Trust with the ability to gain practical experience of engineering, and technical education in a first-class environment, it is very encouraging that local students will have access to such a high-quality resource.

Lastly, I should like to quash certain rumours that have been circulated during the recent local elections that I am not local. I was born in Southmead Hospital, and have lived and worked in the Bristol and South Gloucestershire area all my life. I have resided in this constituency since 2006, having lived in Filton, Frenchay and Bradley Stoke. I currently live near Almondsbury.




have a monthly "lunch club", open to all members and held at a different local venue each time. Watch this space and our Facebook page for confirmation of future event dates and more details.

Paul's Place wins funding from Global's Make Some Noise

This local charity aims to upskill the disabled adults they support and build their confidence through a brand new in-house volunteering programme.

Many disabled adults have skills and knowledge that they can use to give back to the community and gain vital work experience through volunteering. Yet, many volunteer opportunities are not fully accessible. This programme is tailored to the people we support, to help those struggling to come to terms with a disability, those experiencing isolation and those wanting to build their self-confidence.

Inspiring the project is current member (service user). Andy Batten, who wanted to do more than socialise at Paul's Place. Andy became disabled later in life. It was difficult having to leave a career he loved, and the uncertainty of what he was able to do as a disabled adult was having a negative effect on his mental health. One of the charity's aims is to empower disabled adults, so when they found out Andy was a builder by trade, they offered him the chance to use those skills around the day facility. Some light maintenance and DIY work helped a former builder, use his skills once again. Andy also runs regular woodwork skill sessions for other members at Paul's Place.

"It's something that keeps me alive. The accident made me feel useless. Paul's Place is a lifeline for me. I now feel useful and enjoy being here. Sometimes people think I'm just another member

on the days I am in. It sometimes surprises them to learn I'm volunteering that day. It's changing people's perceptions."

The charity quickly saw that many more could benefit from opportunities like this. For many of the people the charity supports, returning to work is not possible but volunteering is a great way to learn new skills and provide a weekly routine and social opportunities. For those who are able to return to work, learning valuable skills with this in-house volunteering programme will give them the right start to hopefully continue to do more outside of Paul's Place.

"We are honoured to have been chosen by Global's Make Some Noise and look forward to being able to share more stories of the disabled adults taking part in the project. We want to show what people are capable of when given the right opportunities and remove preconceptions some may have about what a disabled life could be." Shares Kavley Waller. Fundraising and Communications Manager, Paul's Place.

This project is set to start in April 2024. In the meantime, the charity is focusing on developing an advisory group that acts as a bridge between staff and the members (service users). Cleverly titled the "What Matters?" group, this is a platform for members (service users) to collaborate on a peerled basis.







