

Wellbeing Matters!

Winter Wellbeing

The clocks have changed, the weather has turned and it's getting darker earlier. Not everyone finds this time of year a snuggly, cosy time, so I hope the following tips help you through and out of the other side feeling well, positive and connected.

Sleep Health

Winter brings short days, long nights and lower temperatures. Our bodies naturally need more sleep. Sleep deprivation causes significant immune system compromise and susceptibility to infections. Begin your wind-down routine and head to bed 30 minutes earlier to improve your winter health. Tryptophan-rich foods such as turkey. fish, wholegrains and spinach, support out body's ability to produce mood-lifting serotonin and sleep-enhancing melatonin for a balanced wake-sleep cycle.

Exercise

Wrap up and get outside - even if it's just for 10-20 minutes. Outdoor exercise wakes up our body and metabolism to manage the colder temperatures. Dress in layers to manage your body temperature more effectively. The endorphin buzz you get helps energy levels and mood. Check out Walk Mates - Winterbourne on social media if you are looking for some buddies to motivate you to get moving outside!

Be Sociable

Aim to do something with someone else at least once a week. Long nights and cold evenings when we draw the curtains at 4pm may feel lovely and cosy, but the chances of feeling isolated in winter significantly increases. Try to balance your cosy rest and self-care evenings with a little socialising.

Balanced Meals

Add satisfying proteins into your winter cooking, not just carbohydrate-laden, stodgy tummy fillers. Think chilli-con-carne, hearty stews and casseroles, curries, bolognese, roasted meat or fish traybakes. Including rich sources of protein keeps us fuller for longer, balances our blood sugars and releases nutrients slowly, topping up our mood as well as our energy levels.

Increase Fruit and Vegetables

Make a significant effort to pack the fruit and vegetables into those meals. This is harder in winter when we don't





have farmers markets or garden produce to hand. Buy seasonal autumnal fruits or use frozen berries. Use vegetables to roast, like root vegetables and winter squashes, and enhance those dishes with fresh greens to add more colour. More colours mean a greater breadth of

vitamins and minerals!



Stay Hydrated

We lose a pint of water every day just through breathing in the winter! Cold weather also alters our thirst triggers, so we don't recognise when we need to drink. Sweating under lots of lavers also dehydrates us more easily, never mind having the heating on full blast! Aim for 6-8 glasses of water each day to help with hydration and temperature regulation and keep your skin looking young, fresh and healthy.

Seasonal Supplementation

Vitamin D deficiency is the primary cause of seasonal depression (decreased exposure to sunlight hours). 400IU daily support a robust immune system and healthy mood.

Omega 3 Fish Oils help to decrease inflammation. moisturise the skin, support mood and mental function and maintaining cardiovascular health. Probiotics support our healthy gut bacteria, also crucial for a strong immune system, efficient digestion and production of many of the hormones responsible for feeling positive and happy. Ask me if you need some advice about this.

Let the Air Move Allow the air to circulate around your home

or workspace at least once a day to clear out stale air and germs. Open the windows in the evening if you have your heating on and keep your thermostat at a temperature that allows you to feel cosy but doesn't make your home or work environment the perfect incubator for infection!

Christmas at Winterbourne Medieval Barn

this traditional Christmas celebration.

Please leave your cars in Winterbourne village (the Academy car park will be available) and walk or cycle along Church Lane. If you have a mobility problem, contact the Barn to reserve an on-site parking space.

After the Carols, the Medieval Barn has a short hibernation through the coldest weather, but there are three craft and skills workshops on site in January and February, see website for full details.

Then on 24th March, ushering in the spring, the amazing, Chris Green and Sophie Matthews will return with another hilarious show – Witty Ditties: 400 Years of Comic Song. Tickets (£15) are available on Ticketsource now.










An Unexpected Gift

After all the excitement and stresses of Christmas shopping, the presents sit under the tree waiting to be opened. As givers, we



The main reason for giving gifts at this time of year is to celebrate the birth of Jesus, around 2000 years ago in an innkeeper's stable in Bethlehem. Shepherds were the first to visit Mary and Joseph and their new baby; they may not have had gifts to give him

but their admiration, being poor shepherds. They were followed a while later by Wise Men from the East, who presented Jesus with gifts from treasurechests: gold, frankincense, and myrrh. These represented symbols of the story of Jesus' life to be. Gold is a gift of richness for a king. Myrrh is precious oil, used to anoint the dead. Frankincense is incense used in worship, fitting for a holy child (see Matthew 2.7-12).

The wise men had their treasure-chests containing physical gifts, but gifts cannot always be seen. Each of us have gifts and talents within us, and each of us can make an offering of our own. Our gifts are part of our own story in our work, our homes and our communities. Our gifts show who we are and what we bring to the world around us.

The shepherds in the fields near Bethlehem were the first people to be told of the gift of Jesus.

involving angels invited them to see this baby, with a promise that he was special. An angel told the shepherds 'I am bringing you news of great joy for



all the people'. The angel went on to explain that a Saviour had been born who would bring peace and joy to the world. They visited baby Jesus in the stable and told everyone they met what the angel had said about him, praising God before returning to their fields and their work (see Luke 2.8-20).

> People have always given each other gifts; they would have helped to maintain friendships between different groups in early society. The Christmas traditions that we enjoy today were influenced by the Victorians when Christmas trees and Father Christmas also became popular.

Gift giving and receiving can be stressful but we must not forget that through the birth of Jesus we are given the greatest and most unexpected gift of all. His presence in our lives shapes how we use our inner gifts for others in our communities and families helping them to feel loved and valued. We are all invited to receive this wonderful gift.



Meet your PCC - Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC). Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

As I write, this weekend (12th November) marks Remembrance Sunday, Before my political career, I was in the armed forces for 30 years. Remembrance Day is a poignant day and I will be paying my respects on Sunday in Bristol to our Armed Forces community.

I want to take the opportunity to highlight Priority One of my Police and Crime Plan; Preventing and Fighting Crime and talk specifically about road safety, which is a key area of focus.

If you are a road user, I urge you to be careful when using pathways and pavements. It is important to remember that pavements are solely for the use of pedestrians.

If you are a cyclist or e-scooter user and need to use the pavement to park, please do so with care, especially as the evenings become darker. This ensures accessibility and safety for all road users and pedestrians in Avon and Somerset.

With the early nights drawing in, I would like to remind everyone to be vigilant with their home safety and security.

Burglary is known to increase during the winter months, I recommend you take a few simple measures to help reduce the chances of becoming a victim.

Double check that all your windows and doors are locked, especially before going out, set a light timer to come on whilst you are out to not only deter burglars but help you get into your home safely. If you have an outside space, set up an outdoor sensor light to alert you of anyone arriving at your property and, if it is possible, invest in a burglar alarm and/or CCTV (with signage) for extra peace of mind.

It is also vital that you report any suspicious activity to the police, using 101 or the online reporting form in a non-emergency and 999 where there is a risk to life.

I would like to know your thoughts on the policing part of your council tax.

As your PCC, I am responsible for reviewing the amount of money you contribute to local policing through your council tax bill (known as the precept).

The precept accounts for 41% of police funding. The rest

comes from central Government. Although the Government has not yet confirmed the maximum amount by which PCCs can increase the precept for next year, it will be at least £10 a year for a band D household.

Even if Avon and Somerset Police receive an extra £10 from local people in band D households, our current financial planning shows that increased savings still need to be made.

The size of the savings needed will likely result in about 250 staff roles being cut. These cuts will have an impact on front line services such as visible policing and the ability to investigate crime.

Jack Lopresti, MP - Working for You

This month in Westminster. I met with Roads and Local Transport Minister Richard Holden MP to discuss how we can bring about a solution to the reduction of local bus services, which many children rely on to get to school in our local area. Bus services such as the 458 and 936 have been cut completely by Mayor of the West of England Dan Norris. Funds have been funnelled into other areas such as £8 million on new offices for the West of England Combined Authority (WECA), and have not

only led to local residents facing great difficulties getting from A to B, but also to parents struggling to get their children to school safely and on time.

I am honoured to say that I was recently reelected as Vice President of the Stoke Gifford branch of the Royal British Legion. I attended this year's Poppy Launch at Bristol Parkway station and I have spent many mornings with RBL volunteers collecting for this great charity. was also able to attend and speak at the Royal British Legion Gala Dinner, helped Staple Hill launch the 2023 Poppy Appeal, and buy the first poppy. I also had the pleasure of attending the Office for Veterans' Affairs event in Parliament. I met with veterans and heard inspirational stories from recipients of the Prime Minister's Points of Light Award. With policies such as the Veterans' Railcard; and getting veterans ID cards so they can better access services and their benefits, we can build a country which is the best place in the world to be a veteran.

Promoting aerospace and defence jobs is a key priority and focus of mine. One part of this objective is to expand opportunities for young people through apprenticeship initiatives, in addition to protecting jobs, working with national government support for these vital industries and continuing to press the government to increase defence spending. This October, I visited the Rolls Royce factory in Patchway after the news of global job cuts. We discussed the timings of any possible changes and consultation. I was grateful to receive a briefing on the Tempest jet fighter. I am extremely confident the Patchway





plant will continue to grow and go from strength to strength.

I am so proud of the people, businesses and organisations in our local communities who are

doing some amazing work. I attended the Mad Hatter's Tea Party (centre photo) recently held at Patchway Sports and Social Club to raise money for Bristol Creative Therapies C.I.C – a charity doing God's work with children's play therapy.

I also recently visited The Wave in Easter Compton. They have had a successful year. In addition to providing an excellent facility for locals and tourists alike, they are passionate about giving back to the community and are more than self-sufficient with green energy. Indeed, they are selling energy created at their site back to the National Grid. They are aiming to be open and operating all through the winter this year - fantastic!




