how we might like things to be different in 2024. Every year hundreds of us make New Year's resolutions. Do you?

New Year can be a great time to reflect on what went well last year, what didn't go so well, what we want to do more of, less of, do differently or maybe even stop doing altogether!

As a family, we love to do this over New Year's Eve dinner and decide what our focus will be for the year ahead. I also spend a lot of time in the wellbeing clinic exploring these options with clients, but one thing is always true. If we are allowed to, we will stop. Yep. it's a hard truth but it is true. How many times have you started something and then ground to a halt when the going gets tough? We all do it at one time or another. This is where accountability makes the difference. It really is the thing

that stops us from sabotaging ourselves and guitting.

Human beings are hardwired to conserve energy and take the path of least resistance. It's not laziness, flakiness, lack of focus or resilience, but a deepseated, evolutionary need to conserve energy to preserve our genes. But we're not really talking about preserving genes here are we? Delight at plans for new play equipment at Ridings Road

As part of our ongoing assessment of play equipment in the village, Frampton Cotterell Parish Council is pleased to announce the installation of new play equipment at Ridings Road.

The new equipment will be installed, weather permitting, in January 2024. This follows a survey conducted with parents and children of the parish who very kindly fed in what they would like to see. This improved play area will cater for ages 5-12 years and will be inclusive to all users.

The parish council's Project Officer said: "We had a brilliant response to the survey with residents and children. Thank you to everyone who shared their feedback. We were able to take on most comments received, and we hope to make further planting improvements in the future."

The project will cost in the region of £70,000 and has been made possible with a generous amount of funding. The parish council would especially like to thank the, SUEZ Communities Fund, for making this project possible. We are extremely grateful for this fund's generous contribution of £43,700, without which this project could not go ahead.

New signage will also be installed at the park, the purchase of which was made possible thanks to the generous external, Member Awarded Funding, for the amount of £500.

The parish council hopes that these play area improvements at Ridings Road will benefit the whole community and be enjoyed by the parish for years to come!





Local park tennis courts in Frampton Cotterell set for renovation

Frampton Cotterell Parish Council and the LTA Tennis Foundation (LTA) have announced a partnership to invest in and refurbish public park tennis courts in the Park, Frampton Cotterell. In total, two tennis courts will be renovated, with investment of £119,828.58 helping ensure that quality facilities are available for the local community.

The project is part of a nationwide investment by the UK Government and

LTA, delivered by the LTA, to refurbish public tennis courts across Great Britain, and open up the sport to many more people. This investment will see thousands of existing park tennis courts in poor or unplayable condition brought back to life for the benefit of communities across the country through renovation works, and improved court accessibility with new gate-access technology and booking

Park tennis courts are vital in providing opportunities for children and adults to get active, delivering







significant physical and mental health and wellbeing benefits to participants. Accessible facilities in parks are particularly critical to opening up the sport to those from lower socioeconomic backgrounds and women and girls.

In addition to investment of £41,780,76 from the UK Government and LTA Tennis Foundation. Frampton Cotterell Parish Council have kindly invested £78,047.82 of South Gloucestershire Council (SGC) S106 funding, awarded for improvements to outdoor sports facilities, to ensure the courts and the fencing will be completed to an excellent standard.

Alongside the investment, Frampton Cotterell Parish Council will also work with the LTA to deliver a range of activities on these tennis courts. This will include weekly organised free park tennis sessions for all ages, playing levels and experience where equipment is provided, meaning that people will not need someone to play with or their own racket. Local Tennis Leagues will also provide friendly, sociable, opportunities to get active through local competition.

The park courts being renovated are in the park next to the Cricket and Rugby Clubs. The courts will have online booking found via the LTA website, www.lta. org.uk/play. This will make it far easier to find and book a tennis court or activity in Frampton Cotterell on these courts.

Work started in autumn 2023, and is due to be completed ready for play later in 2024

Meet your PCC - Mark Shelford

Avon & Somerset Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC). Mark Shelford was elected as Conservative PCC in 2021.

I hope everyone had a wonderful time over the festive period.

I would like to start the New Year by thanking all the officers and emergency services staff who have worked tirelessly to keep our communities safe over the past few weeks.

The Police Funding Survey is now live online. I encourage every resident to give their thoughts on my proposal to increase the policing part of the council tax, known as the precept, by £10 a year (that's the equivalent of 83 pence per month) for the average band D household. The survey will close on 22 January.

Local policing is funded by a combination of people's council tax (the precept), Home Office funding, and other grants. The precept makes up 41% of police funding and I, as your PCC, am responsible for setting the amount of money residents contribute to local policing through the precept. You can access the link to the precept survey on the OPCC website.

Last month, my office launched a new volunteer recruitment campaign looking for members of the public from all backgrounds and walks of life to visit people in one of three custody centres we have in Avon and Somerset based in Keynsham, Patchway and Bridgwater.

These volunteer roles are called Independent Custody Visitors and they perform a vital role in ensuring people who are detained in custody following arrest are aware of their rights and are receiving what they are entitled to.

If you can spare two hours per month, at a time to suit you, to partner with another custody volunteer and undertake a visit please apply before 18 January. No experience is necessary, just a commitment to seeing fair, efficient and effective policing in our communities. Visit our website and go to the 'Get Involved' section.

Lurge people to be extra careful when shopping online at any time, but particularly this time of year as we see online shopping increase in the annual January sales.

Many people are looking for bargains after the Christmas period and I warn shoppers: if it looks too good to be true. it probably is!

I was supported by Lord Michael Howard, Liz Truss MP, Sir Iain Duncan Smith MP, and Mark Francois MP. It is so important that we in the United Kingdom work with our allies around the world to defend democracy and freedom in Ukraine, Israel, and elsewhere.





Our area is making a significant contribution to the war effort in Ukraine with our fantastic defence and aerospace industries which are globally renowned, in addition to the great team at DE&S Abbey Wood. Indeed, while I was in Washington DC. I visited the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum in which I saw exhibits like British-built Rolls-Royce aerospace engines.

I recently welcomed members of the Ghana Community Bristol to Parliament and my team showed them around. Many thanks to my colleague and friend Cllr. Franklin Owusu-Antwi for his help in organising this fantastic event.

I met with Peter Brown from Estrans Limited in my Bradley Stoke office and heard about the great plans for new homes being built in Swanmoor Stoke, with fantastic infrastructure investment including a by-pass for Easter Compton and the upgrading of Pilning Station. Building new homes, especially social and affordable housing, is the only way of solving the housing crisis and increasing equality of opportunity, especially for our young


