Route will be from the Winterbourne Academy through Bradley Stoke as per previous years – but due to the closure area on Bradley Stoke Way the ride will go down past Baileys Court Pub, and join Brook Way. We ride along Brook Way then turn right heading towards the Three Brooks Pub, passing across the roundabout on the entrance to Tesco. We then rejoin our normal route on Bradley Stoke Way adjacent to Tesco and the Leisure Centre.

Bikes will then go down Gloucester Road into Bristol with the ride ending at the Long Ashton Park and Ride. The route will be fully marshalled. The ride takes place entirely on open public roads – so all bikes should be road legal and all normal road rules apply!

Collection buckets will be available along various parts of the route.

Plus there will be a Raffle with hopefully some pretty special "pledges" kindly donated by local companies and hotels.

Every penny raised is donated to the Bristol Children's Hospice South West with our main contact at the Hospice being Lucie Perryman.

A limited number of bikes attend the Hospice so it is not too overwhelming for the residents.

Please do look out for the Santas on their Bikes as they pass through on 6th December and support their fundraising efforts if you can.

Metalwork Christmas Decorations – Wednesday 3rd December, 6.30–9pm



Create your own brass or copper Christmas tree decoration in this relaxed and festive evening workshop. You will use a piercing saw and a combination of texturing hammers, Christmas-inspired

punches and letter punches, and spend time playing with heat colouring and patina techniques using cooking torches, before polishing and adding your chosen ribbon. The price includes full tuition and all equipment and materials, along with mince pies, mulled wine and Christmas music to enjoy your evening.

Music and Drama

Carols in the Barn – Saturday 13th and Sunday 14th December, 3pm

Experience the old Christmas story told through a light-hearted drama suitable for all ages. The medieval Barn makes a very atmospheric setting for a quirky re-telling of the story by members of St Michael's Church, and the drama is interspersed with lots of well-known traditional carols for everyone to sing along. Tickets include mulled wine and mince pies, served from 2.15pm before the Carols start at 3pm.

Why not book a workshop place or a ticket for an event in 2026 for an unusual gift? A selection of craft workshops for January to March 2026 will be on sale shortly, including fused glass, wood carving, making medieval clay tiles, and willow weaving. Numbers are limited to small groups and workshops tend to sell out very fast. Varied musical events restart in

March with a St Patrick's Day ceilidh. Full details of the early spring events will be on the website in December.

The Medieval Barn is fully accessible for wheelchairs. Free parking at the Barn for all events, and plenty of space for drop off / pick up and bicycles.

The Barn is a wonderful heritage building kept open for the community by a large team of local volunteers. The Trust is always looking for more people (age 18+) to help with maintaining the site, preparing for events (setting out chairs, tables, stage blocks) or clearing away, helping on the day at events (on the door, bar work, car parking, etc), or being part of the team running community events (including admin, publicity, social media etc). 

Listening to singing makes an audience feel good and singing makes choir members feel good when they are doing it too. Group singing has additional benefits that are not always obvious. Singing in a choir provides physical activity in the form of breathing control, social interaction and mental stimulation. All of these are enormously important to general wellbeing and happiness as well as combatting the deteriorating effects of ageing. Studies have shown that singing can lead to improvements in mood and measurable reductions in stress and inflammation. Singing is also good for heart health as it mimics exercise by increasing the amount of oxygen taken in and increasing heart rate while helping synchronisation between heart rhythms and respiration. All in all, singing is intrinsically beneficial for health and just good fun to boot. As always, **the choir is actively seeking new voices to join its ranks**. No auditions are required – just an enjoyment of singing and a willingness to be part of a welcoming, down to earth musical ensemble. Wellbeing Matters!

Your Winter Balance

The clocks have changed, the air feels sharper, and the evenings draw in fast. For some, winter feels like a warm blanket; for others, it can feel heavy, quiet and a little overwhelming. However you find this

season, here are some simple tips to help you move through the colder months feeling more content.



Rest + Sleep

Shorter days naturally change our rhythms, so lean in. A consistent wind-down routine, lower evening light, and heading to bed earlier can make a noticeable difference to your energy, mood and immunity. Think of sleep as your winter medicine. Foods rich in tryptophan — such as turkey, eggs, oats, nuts and spinach — help your body produce serotonin and melatonin for a calmer mind and deeper sleep. *Tip: A warm drink, softer lighting and screens off 30 minutes before bed.*

Move Daily (and Wrap Up!)

Movement in winter just needs to be consistent. Even 10–20 minutes outdoors gives your metabolism a nudge, supports immunity, and boosts mood thanks to daylight exposure and those lovely endorphins. So, layer up, and think “keep warm, keep moving”. If a full workout feels tough, a brisk walk, gentle mobility session or dancing in the kitchen still counts. *Tip: Try not to sit for longer than an hour at a time. Winter sedentary syndrome is real! Local? Check out Walk Mates - Winterbourne on Facebook for friendly walking buddies and motivation.*

Stay Connected

It's tempting to hunker down when it gets dark at 4pm, but winter isolation can creep in.

Aim to spend time with others at least once a week — a walk, a coffee, a craft activity / exercise class or even a phone call. Social connection isn't optional for wellbeing; it's essential. Balance cosy nights with people-time.

Eat to Nourish + Energise

Comfort food is one of winter's great joys — just keep it balanced. Pair satisfying carbohydrates with quality protein: stews, chilli, bean dishes, casseroles, soups with lentils or chicken, or roasted fish and veg. You'll stay fuller for longer, keep blood sugar steady, and support mood, muscle and

energy. *Tip: Get those recipe books out or join Tip the Balance Support Group on Facebook for some inspiration. Winter produce can still be vibrant. Think squash, beetroot, mushrooms, parsnips, cabbage and winter greens. Frozen berries and mixed vegetables are brilliant too — nutritious, budget-friendly, and zero waste. More colours = wider nutrients = a happier immune system.*

Hydrate (Even When You Don't Feel Thirsty)

Cold weather dulls our thirst and central heating dries us out. *Aim for 6–8 glasses of fluid a day - water, herbal tea, even tea & coffee count - It all supports hydration, digestion and a winter glow.*

Support from the Inside

Vitamin D is important in winter when sunlight exposure is low. Public Health England recommends 10 micrograms (400 IU) daily in autumn and winter for most adults. Omega-3 and probiotics can also support immunity, mood and gut health. *Tip: Unsure what you need? just ask — personalised guidance beats guesswork.*

Warmth & Fresh Air

A warm body supports your heart, immune system and mental wellbeing. Layer clothing, use blankets or hot-water bottles safely, and aim to keep living areas comfortably warm — ideally >18°C. *Tip: Once a day, open a window briefly to let stale air out, shift germs, moisture and condensation, and gives your brain a lift.*

Winter isn't about perfection — it's about rhythm, nourishment and connection.

Choose two or three practices that feel achievable and revisit them each week. Small, steady actions create big seasonal shifts.

Earlier in the autumn it was great to hear from Coalpit Heath resident, Frederick Hopkins, who has kindly shared his family's epic summer adventure when he cycled the 933 miles from John O' Groats to Lands End!

The journey, over twelve legs, was a true family affair, with his wife Gem and daughter Darcy driving the support vehicle with him all the way.

This story began in September 2023 when Gem was diagnosed with breast cancer and their world turned upside down. Gem's journey has been difficult. Chemotherapy, mastectomy, central lymph node clearance followed by a full lymph node clearance, Radiotherapy and 10 years of medication.

Now, a year on from Gem receiving treatment in hospital, Frederick wanted to show his appreciation to Breast Cancer Now, who supported Gem and their family so magnificently throughout. Frederick also felt Gem deserved something big, to mark the resilience and courage she fought cancer with, all while continuing to be the best mum and role model to Darcy.

Frederick shares his thoughts on the challenge, "Whenever it got tough, I just had to think, my wife Gem had it worse. It was emotional enough, but on my first day, I started receiving messages of support from friends and family that she had co-ordinated. What a woman!"

"Spiritual wellbeing means different things to different people, but for me, it's about doing something bigger than yourself. A sense of wellbeing by giving back. It's good to be good, and as a bare minimum, I hope we have been able to show Darcy this."





Even though it was written in 1868, 157 years ago, that line feels as poignant now as then. Our hopes and anxieties find their answer in Jesus. In a world of displacement, division, and disconnection, God's plan offers a radical hope. As we zoom out to see this bigger picture of this wonderful plan, it's a plan that brings hope to all in our world".

'I wonder if the story is true?' 'I wonder if Christmas really is about Christ?' 'I wonder if there is hope to be found'? All are welcome to any of the Christmas services in the area – see full details on opposite page.

And to close, many blessings to you for the Advent and Christmas period – may everyone bring a spark of small wonder into all of life.

1st Ram Hill Scouts Group needs your help!

Youth groups in the UK continue to clamour for more volunteers amid a rise in the number of parents seeking affordable and sociable outdoor activities for their children away from screens. The Scouts in particular are facing substantial unmet demand for their sessions and have said their waiting list, nationally at 170,000, has hit a historic highs.

1st Ram Hill Scouts was established in late 2024 to meet a local need and opened with Beavers (6-8 years) and Cubs (8 - 10 years) based around the ages of the children of volunteers who were invested in the project. This was extended later in 2025 to include Squirrels (4 - 6 years) and more recently Scouts (10 - 14 years) as more volunteers arrived. 1st Ram Hill, like the rest of the UK, are a victim of their own success and now has over 60 places on their waiting list!

Benefits for the children attending are many and varied; where they can earn badges for different topics, including: Camps, Hikes, Crafts, Outdoor Cooking, Fire Starting, Contributing to the Community, Gardening to mention only a few. Additionally there have been visits organized for the troop to the RNLI at Portishead, Westonbirt National Arboretum, Slimbridge Wetland Centre and 'We the Curious' science museum with a Panto show in Bath planned for Christmas.

Volunteers' commitment can be surprisingly small at only a few hours a month with the flexibility to 'dip in and out' where and when they feel they have free time. As people's situation changes then the organization has the flexibility to respond appropriately to meet the new circumstance. The point being that there is a place for anyone to have an opportunity to support the team. Experience does show that volunteers get so much from the venture and the table below shows typical commitments that each of the opportunities might take. Training is provided where necessary and you would always have the help and support of the team.

Preparation continues for the new A432 Badminton Road bridge

We were delighted to receive these aerial photos of the latest developments in the replacement of the Badminton bridge, which show the steel beams being installed during the recent closure of the M4 in late October. Our thanks goes to Winterbourne Down resident Paul Thomson, who is a member of a local model flying club and who took these excellent pictures by flying his drone as the works took place.

The original bridge was constructed in 1966 and underwent regular routine checks. In July 2023, detailed structural investigations took place and the bridge was deemed unsafe and thus the decision was taken to close the bridge and plan for the structure to be replaced.

In autumn 2024 the bridge was demolished and in autumn 2025 the installation of the new steel beams took place as the next stage in the progress of the new bridge. We are all eager for the new bridge to open, which is currently planned for spring 2026 (according to the National Highways website: <https://nationalhighways.co.uk/our-roads/south-west/a432-badminton-road-bridge-crossing-the-m4/>).

Charitable trust behind Active Lifestyle Centres celebrates 20th anniversary

The charitable trust responsible for running South Gloucestershire's five Active Lifestyle Centres is celebrating its 20th anniversary with a nod to the past and a vision for the future.

Circadian Trust was formed on 1 November 2005 when South Gloucestershire Council handed over the reins of its in-house leisure operation to the trust, a social enterprise operating as an independent charity, tasked with balancing commercial reality with social conscience.


Its not-for-profit status has enabled the Trust to reinvest more than £16m in modernising services and facilities at its centres in Bradley Stoke, Kingswood, Longwell Green, Thornbury and Yate, including a £2.5m refurbishment programme for the gyms at all five centres, and £1m on rooftop solar panels.

Members and visitors will see the anniversary being celebrated with helium balloon displays, banners and bowls of sweets in each centre's reception.

CEO Mark Crutchley, who has been at the helm for all but six months of Circadian's 20 years, says: "We've had to shape the vision - several visions over 20 years, in fact - to deliver congruent strategies that improve performance but also compliment stakeholders' requirements.

"That's taken some doing in terms of coalescence, shared understanding and a direction that is seeing us pivot towards health and wellbeing and not just fitness."

The most recent example of the pivot is community support days for people with musculoskeletal (MSK) conditions at Bradley Stoke and Thornbury Active Lifestyle Centres, giving patients access to healthcare professionals, such as physiotherapists, to help them manage their condition while fast-tracking anyone in need of further help and support.

After a period when we were open reduced hours, we are very excited to announce that we will now be open Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 10am to 4pm. However, this will still vary occasionally subject to volunteer and staff availability, so we always advise you phone us first before dropping in.

We offer for hire mobility scooters of different sizes, including those that can be taken apart and put in the boot of a car, and wheelchairs that you can self-propel, or a carer can assist you with.

Yate shopping centre is an ideal location for people using mobility scooters and wheelchairs as it is flat and has over 100 shops, a mixture of independents and chain stores, all of which are accessible, along with a good choice of coffee shops and cafes. The shopping centre has plenty of disabled parking and we can meet you at your car or the bus stop with a scooter or wheelchair. The shopmobility office has a disabled toilet as does the shopping centre.

Anyone with limited mobility is welcome to use our service, young and older people, those with a permanent or temporary disability or injury, or perhaps you are deciding whether to buy your own scooter and want to try one out for a couple of hours first. If you or a relative are on holiday in our area, you are very welcome too.

As demand varies, it is advisable to book in advance, but feel free to drop in too or phone us with any queries.

We also offer longer term hire of the scooters that dismantle and wheelchairs if you want to use one for a week or two due to a temporary disability such as following a hip replacement or have a relative visiting who needs one.

We are always on the look out for volunteers to join our small but friendly team, for either a regular half day or full day. Full training will be given, you can drink as much tea and coffee as you like, and if it's a quiet day, you can even read the

newspaper or a book! You do have to be fit enough to move the equipment around and demonstrate how it all works, including dismantling and reassembling the transportable scooters. 


